

NEW! Dairy Certificate Program for OSU Undergraduates

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A dairy focused program for undergraduate students enrolled at The Ohio State University has just been released. This Program is of interest not only to undergraduate students but also to employers of students who have interest and training in working in the dairy industry. Employers can tap into the Program by sponsoring the recognition event and staying informed of which students are enrolled in the Program for potential employment.

The Department of Animal Science at The Ohio State University has continued to provide many academic and extracurricular opportunities for students interested in the dairy industry. However, this certificate program brings a greater focus to these opportunities and provides direction to students of the courses and experiences that they need in order to be better prepared for a position in the dairy industry, whether that means working on a dairy farm, seeking a position in the agri-business sector, or continuing in advanced educational pursuits. Although the Program aligns well for students who major in Animal Sciences at The Ohio State University, the Program is available to any student enrolled at OSU. Some of the requirements for the program also align with the expectations of a minor in Animal Sciences. The general requirements for the Program are completion of 37 credit hours in specified courses, completion of a dairy-related internship, and participation in the Dairy Challenge Program.
